*	Getting started	The club has started structuring its social responsibility, aligning with national and european standards, nevertheless the scope and depth of the activities is still small. This is a normal level to be at for clubs who have joined professional football in the last 3 years.
**	In development	The club has an approved FSR plan and is developing activities and projects, as part of it. FSR is starting to become a visible part within the club and some resources are starting to get allocated to it. The club is able to come through on the national FSR campaigns and meetings organized by the PL.
***	Good	The club has an FSR plan and programme according to the Pro League standards. There are resources (especially financially and HR) allocated and the club has developed its own identity within the FSR landscape in the PL and a sustainable commitment from the club is shaping up.
****	Great	The club goes beyond the expectations and requirements of the PL, in terms of allocating resources over several seasons and setting up projects and activities. This is a club that is positively recognized in its direct environment and by local stakeholders.
*****	Excellent	This is a club with performant and measurable projects, taking on a pioneer role within the PL's FSR landscape. FSR is a core component of the clubs identity and this is widely known and recognized. As a consequence the club has a sustained commitment to allocate resources to the implementation of its FSR plan.
